




## BE THE CHURCH~~~

## Some Facts About Lent

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday. That day is so named because in the early church ashes were sprinkled on the heads of penitent Christians.

This custom remains today and is becoming more wide spread in the Protestant Churches. The sign of the cross on forehead or in the palm of the hand symbolizes our being open to God and offering ourselves with clean hearts before our God.

The color for Lent is purple, reminding us of Lent's penitential mood.

Lent lasts forty days, until Easter. but if you count the days from Ash Wednesday until Easter Sunday, you get 46. That's because Sundays are excluded from the count (and from Lent). They are designed as "feast days," commemorating the <u>resurrection</u>.

The origin of the word LENT is the Anglo-Saxon word, LENCTEN, meaning "spring", the time when the days lengthen.

In some families there is the tradition of "giving up" something for Lent. That evolved from the idea that Lent was a period of fasting in preparation for baptism which was observed on Easter Eve.

Thankfully, most of us have progressed from the idea of "giving up" (Self denial) to the idea of "taking on" for the good of others.

There are many ways Christians benefit from Lent today. The season encourages us to set aside time for quiet contemplation...to read, meditate, and pray; to reflect on the direction of our own personal lives and on the meaning of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

It reminds us that we are a part of a community of faith that makes a profound difference in our lives and in the way we reach out to those near at hand as well as those on the other side of the world.

In short, Lent is a time to reflect on the relationship between our lives and our faith, between Jesus' journey and our own.

## DEACONS CORNER

Is this stupid pandemic over yet? Yes, we all have been very frustrated with the tenacity that this little bug has been showing, but fortunately, most of our congregation has been fully vaccinated, and the statistics show that the little critter has slowed down considerably! However, in answer to the question, NO, the pandemic is not over yet! You may now put your mask down in most places, but do NOT let your guard down. We are still hearing about friends & family getting Covid, even those who have been fully vaccinated!

As the numbers of people attending Sunday's in-person services rise, so does the risk of infection rise. But unlike during the height of the Omicron surge, the risk is much smaller. If you have a compromised health issue, wear the mask, just like a fair number of attendees continue to do. If you want to socially distance, go for it! Make smart decisions! The pundits and experts now admit that we may never beat this bug, so we may just have to learn to live with it.

The good news is, if you are still uncomfortable in a crowd, we are still posting each service to YouTube, and Seekonk Channel 9 is still running the video during the week. We have no plans to discontinue this. And, we are still making DVDs for those without an Internet connection. Let us know if you need one, and, if you need a DVD player.

We are still planning on doing Live Streaming, but some of the necessary equipment we ordered many months ago, still has not shipped, apparently due to the ubiquitous "chip problem"! Stay tuned for further information.

While on that subject, we must give a huge bunch of thanks to Carl Provost, who not only continues to "loan" us his camera (since March 2020) but who is also taking the video from the camera, editing it in many ways, then posting it to YouTube and sending it to Channel 9. Thanks also to our camera operators, Pat Smith, Lori Ferreira and James Siegfried. And a look back at the pandemic reminds us we should thank Josh Wright again, for allowing us to continue services via his video editing, despite the lockdown in 2020.

Sarah Stevenson will not have a Caring Ministry meeting on the first Sunday in April (April 3rd) but will be having a Lenten Session on Thursday, March 24th at 7:00 pm called Essential Self-Care.
