From the Interim Pastor



I'm always delighted when I can share words of wisdom from our denominational leaders. This article by our Conference Minister, Rev. Darrell Goodwin, is addressed to clergy but really applies to all of us as we seek to widen our welcome to all of God's children who seek to be in relationship with others who are openhearted, Bible-centered, and justice-focused. Have a blessed summer and don't be a stranger...we're here every week!

To my fellow pastors and ministry leaders:

Each week, whether in person or online, people walk through the doors of our churches carrying invisible burdens, quiet hopes, and deep questions. Some come out of curiosity, others out of desperation. Many are searching for belonging before they're ready for a faith connection.

In this moment when community is more fragile and more necessary than ever, how we welcome newcomers matters deeply. Not just the handshake or the coffee, but the culture we cultivate the way our spaces speak love before we do.

Here are a few gentle reminders as we shape our worshiping communities into places of radical welcome:

1. Start with sincere hospitality. Not just "sign of peace" but notice who's on the margins. Assign hospitality as ministry, not just logistics. Train greeters to see people, not just manage bulletins.

2. Avoid insider language. Churchy words, unexplained rituals, and assumptions of shared belief can feel like locked doors. Offer gentle context without diluting your message. At my local church for a while I pit little explanations In the bulletin that explained what things were, Thia helped the folks In the pews and visitors.

3. Honor the visitor's vulnerability. They've already done something brave by showing up. Avoid singling them out. Instead, create an environment where no one feels like a guest only like a friend you hadn't met yet.

4. Follow up with care, not pressure. A kind message or note of gratitude can go a long way. But don't overwhelm new folks with too much too soon. Let your community be the invitation. Our excitement when a new person comes can be overwhelming to them so we must find a healthy balance.

5. Empower your congregation to welcome. Hospitality isn't the job of a team it's the culture of a church. Teach your people how to listen, include, and make room.

6. Be clear about who you are. In a time when many fear rejection from churches, be clear about your welcome especially across lines of identity, belief, or background. People shouldn't have to guess if they'll be safe. In the Southern New England Conference, United Church of Christ we have started the <u>www.findhopenow.org</u> campaign. Visit the website and use the marketing templates.

Above all, let's remember: The gospel was never meant to be gated. We are not gatekeepers we are hosts of a feast of grace. Let's set a table so wide and so full that no one ever questions whether there's room for them.

Let us welcome as we have been welcomed.

As you have noticed, we now have ceiling fans in the Sanctuary that will provide cooling and the circulation of air which will defray the cost of using the air conditioning system. The air conditioning in the Memorial Room has been replaced and is now in working order. The handicapped toilet for the Gardner Building bathroom is being purchased and will soon be installed. Thanks again to Shelley Alves for her generous donation for these repairs.



The kitchen drawers in the Gardner kitchen have been rebuilt and will soon be replaced. All the thermostats have been reset for the upcoming summer weather.

The County Street parking lot pot holes has once again been repaired, however there is still hope that we can raise enough funds to replace the entire parking lot.

The mission group Incredible Days has renewed their contract with us and will be here again July 27-30. Because they have had a wonderful experience with the use of our Gardner building and Sanctuary, they have also told other mission groups which will increase our rental income.

Inspections to both buildings for fire alarms, extinguishers, sprinkler systems and kitchen range hood continue in the next few months.

We are both thankful and saddened that our Co-Chair, Craig Mace is going off the Board. Craig has been and incredible source of information, leadership and has always been at the church when emergencies have risen. Jason Langille is also going off the Board and has done an incredible job in keeping up the grounds including mowing, raking, painting, the list goes on. Jason has also agreed to continue to mow the grass until the Fall, well beyond the time he leaves the Board.

However, despite the loss of Craig and Jason, coming on the Board is David Graham and Brian Bujold...welcome!! Thank you all for your support.
